If someone would be asked **«are the arts flourishing within a growing economy?»** with no doubt he/she would agree with a positive response.

More money means more art to be produced, in a competitive global economy where creativity is playing its own special role.

But if the question is ****how much innovative are artists living in a growing economy?**** the answer would be surprising.

According to cultural economists Cellini and Cuccia, in a growing economy artists will prefer to be conservative rather than innovative, if philanthropy and public funds are inadequate.

ready or not? discovering Brazilian openness to change is an interdisciplinary research and public talk conceived by Italian cultural economist Chiara Tinonin, to be produced in occasion of the International Residency Program at Barracão Maravilha in Rio de Janeiro in September 2013, to explore the willingness of Brazilian visual artists to innovate, during one of the major socioeconomical growth in the history of the Country.

By **interviewing** established and emerging artists, curators, collectors and professionals in the Brazilian art world, with the support of the Delegation of the **Brazilian Ministry of Culture in Rio de Janeiro**, the aim of the project is also to document the current **awareness on the role of philanthropy and public funds to stimulate cultural experimentation.**

ready or not? discovering Brazilian openness to change won the International Residency Program 2013 at Barracão Maravilha in Rio de Janeiro, where it is going to be produced and shown.
